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Abstract— This article aims to explain the emergence of Bandaya Sahitya (Protest Literature) in Kannada literature during the 1970s as a powerful literary movement that voiced resistance against social inequality, caste oppression, and economic injustice. Rooted in progressive ideologies and influenced by Dalit and socialist movements in Karnataka, Bandaya literature redefined Kannada literary expression by shifting its focus from aesthetic and romantic concerns to socio-political realities. This paper examines the historical background of the emergence of Bandaya Sahitya in Kannada literature and evaluates its impact on Kannada literature and society. As per result, As a result, the emergence and development of Bandaya Sahitya in Kannada literature can be understood as a significant literary movement shaped by socio-political realities and sustained by a strong commitment to social justice, equality, and resistance against oppression.

Among these progressive literary developments, Bandaya Sahitya emerged as a major post-Navya literary movement in the 1970s and 1980s in Karnataka. The term “Bandaya” literally means rebellion or resistance, and it represents a conscious literary effort to challenge established structures of social inequality, caste oppression, and literary elitism. This movement arose largely as a response to the perceived limitations of Navya literature, particularly its intellectual elitism and detachment from the lived realities of marginalized communities. Bandaya writers rejected the idea of literature as mere aesthetic expression and instead redefined it as a powerful instrument of social transformation and protest. Thus, Bandaya Sahitya

occupies a significant place in Kannada literary history as a movement that brought together literature, ideology, and social activism to voice the struggles of the oppressed and promote social justice.

The movement took a formal shape with the establishment of the Bandaya Sahitya Sanghatane in 1974. of Bandaya Sahitya as protest literature in the 1970s was not an isolated literary event but the result of long-standing social, political, and cultural transformations in Karnataka. Its historical background is deeply connected to caste oppression, class inequality, growing political consciousness, and earlier literary movements.

Major Writers of Bandaya Sahithya

Bandaya Sahitya (Rebel Literature) is a progressive Kannada literary movement that emerged in the 1970s. It rejected elitist aesthetics in favor of socially committed writing and sought to use literature as a powerful tool against caste, class, and gender-based oppression. His writings are known for their intense, protest-driven poetic expression that strongly highlights the lived realities, struggles, and oppression faced by Dalit communities.

Through his writings, he highlights issues such as inequality, exploitation, and social injustice, thereby contributing significantly to the progressive and protest-oriented tradition of Kannada literature.
3	Banu Mushtaq	Banu Mushtaq is a pioneering feminist and progressive writer associated with Kannada literature. Her short stories critically address the lived experiences and challenges of marginalized Muslim women, focusing on issues of gender, identity, and social exclusion. Her acclaimed collection Heart Lamp gained international recognition and was awarded the International Booker Prize in 2025, highlighting her significant contribution to contemporary feminist and progressive literary discourse.
4	Chennanna Walikar	Chennanna Walikar is regarded as a leading poet and critic associated with the Bandaya Sahitya movement. His writings primarily focus on the socio-economic inequalities experienced by marginalized communities, highlighting issues of exploitation, discrimination, and social injustice.
5	Chandrashekar Patil (Champa)	A fierce playwright, poet, and prominent literary figure who used satire to fight social injustice.
6	Kalegowda Nagavar	A key organizer and writer who brought traditional folklore narratives into the Bandaya consciousness.
7	Sara Aboobacker	A vital feminist and Bandaya voice. Her novels highlight the double-bind of women living under patriarchal and religious constraints.
8	D.R. Nagaraj	He is one of the movement's founders. He was a brilliant cultural critic who provided the theoretical framework for Bandaya and Dalit literature.

1. Social and Caste-based Context: Karnataka society for centuries was structured around a rigid caste hierarchy, where Dalits and other marginalized communities were subjected to untouchability, social exclusion, and economic exploitation. These lived realities created deep dissatisfaction among oppressed groups, which later found expression in literature through Bandaya Sahitya.

2. Post-Independence Socio-political Changes: After India's independence in 1947, constitutional guarantees of equality and social justice raised expectations among marginalized communities. However, in practice, caste discrimination and economic inequality continued, especially in rural Karnataka. This gap between constitutional ideals and social reality contributed to the rise of protest consciousness.

3. Influence of Progressive and Marxist Ideologies: During the 1960s and 1970s, Karnataka witnessed the spread of Marxist, socialist, and progressive ideas. These ideologies emphasized class struggle, workers' rights, and opposition to exploitation. They strongly influenced young writers and intellectuals, who began to view literature as a tool for social change.

4. Role of Dalit Consciousness Movements: The growth of Dalit awareness and organized movements, particularly the Dalit Sangharsha Samiti (DSS), played a crucial role in shaping Bandaya Sahitya. These movements gave voice to the lived experiences of Dalits and inspired writers to represent marginalized identities in literature.

5. Reaction against Navya Literature: Bandaya Sahitya also emerged as a reaction to Navya (modernist) literature, which was seen by some writers as highly intellectual, urban-centered, and detached from rural and marginalized realities. Bandaya writers criticized this elitism and demanded a literature rooted in social struggle and lived experience.

6. Influence of Global and Indian Protest Traditions: The movement was also influenced by broader protest traditions, including: Indian progressive literature in other languages, anti-colonial and socialist writings and global movements for civil rights and equality

These influences encouraged Kannada writers to adopt literature as a form of resistance.

Impact of Bandaya Sahitya on Kannada Literature and Society

The Bandaya Sahitya movement had a profound and lasting impact on both Kannada literature and the broader socio-cultural landscape of Karnataka. Emerging in the 1970s as a protest-oriented literary movement, it redefined the purpose of literature by transforming it into a powerful medium of social engagement, resistance, and reform. The major impacts of the movement are discussed below:

1. Impact on Kannada Literature

- **Democratization of Literature:** Bandaya Sahitya broke the dominance of elite and urban-centered writing by bringing marginalized voices—such as Dalits, backward classes, and rural communities—into mainstream Kannada literature. This democratization significantly expanded the scope of literary expression.
- **Shift from Aestheticism to Social Commitment:** Earlier Bandaya Sahitya, much of Navya literature focused on intellectual and philosophical concerns. Bandaya literature shifted this focus toward social reality, lived experience, and political responsibility, thereby redefining the purpose of literature itself.
- **Emergence of New Literary Voices:** The emergence of new literary voices was a key feature of the movement, as it encouraged writers from oppressed communities to become poets and authors. Writers such as Siddalingaiah, Devanur Mahadeva, and others introduced fresh perspectives grounded in lived experiences of inequality, marginalization, and resistance.
- **Transformation of Language and Style:** Transformation of language and style was a defining feature of Bandaya Sahitya, as it promoted the use of simple, direct, and spoken Kannada while rejecting heavily Sanskritized or elitist forms of expression. This shift made literature more accessible to ordinary readers.
- **Expansion of Themes in Kannada Literature:** The movement also led to a significant expansion of themes in Kannada literature. It brought greater attention to issues such as caste oppression, class exploitation, rural hardship, questions of identity and dignity, and the idea of resistance and rebellion.

2. Impact on Society

- **Rise of Social Awareness:** The rise of social awareness was one of the major contributions of Bandaya Sahitya, as it significantly heightened

public consciousness about caste discrimination and social injustice within Karnataka society.

- **Empowerment of Marginalized Communities:** The movement also contributed to the empowerment of marginalized communities by giving voice and visibility to Dalits and other oppressed groups. It encouraged self-respect, identity assertion, and greater social confidence among these communities.
- **Influence on Social Movements:** The movement also had a significant influence on social movements, as Bandaya literature supported and strengthened real-life organizations such as the Dalit Sangharsha Samiti. In doing so, it contributed to broader struggles for equality, dignity, and social justice.
- **Cultural Transformation:** The movement also brought about a cultural transformation by challenging traditional norms and hierarchies. It encouraged the development of a more inclusive and democratic cultural environment in Karnataka.
- **Educational and Academic Influence:** The movement also had a notable educational and academic influence, as Bandaya texts were incorporated into university syllabi and scholarly discussions. This helped bring issues of caste, inequality, and social justice into formal education systems.
